I will never miss Hadassah's Convention if I can at all help it. This is a promise I made to myself since my first Hadassah Convention back in 2007 when I was living in New York City. Since convention was only 3 subway stops away from my apartment, at the time it was very convenient. I had been to medical conventions through my husband's work and had seen how large and impressive they can be. I was not expecting much more than a couple of business-like meetings from this one, so I signed up for single-day participation. To my delight and surprise, the amount of information, the didactic material, the camaraderie, the masses of Jewish women, and the fantastic spirit throughout were incredible. I immediately signed up for the following day; Convention is my Hadassah shot-in-the-arm. You get energized and revitalized by listening to the reports on all the magnificent Hadassah projects, and you know that your hard work...my hard work...our hard work is saving lives and changing the world for the better. This is the ownership I need in order to convey my belief in Hadassah and the works I support.

I can talk about politics in Israel and tell people that I heard directly from Mark Regev, spokesman for Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. I can also talk about human rights in the Middle East and tell them that I heard from Jordana Luks Cutler, deputy to the senior advisor to the Prime Minister, who asserted, "The time has come to put a stop to this hypocrisy and to work towards genuine women's rights and human rights in the Middle East." I can say that I know PM Netanyahu has great appreciation for Hadassah's commitment to the Jewish people. I am aware of the medical, biomedical, and technical advances that are being conducted at Hadassah Medical Organization. I can say that I want to visit the 21,000-square-foot, reinforced indoor recreation facility for children in Sderot that Hadassah helped build with JNF. I can proudly mention that I was there to accept a certificate of recognition on behalf of the Harrisburg Hadassah Young Women's Coalition for placing second in The Judith Epstein Leadership Awards. I can mention that more Israeli companies are listed on the US NASDAQ than any country outside the United States and China, and that Israel attracts more global venture capital per capita than any other country. I can recount the dozens of testimonials I heard retelling the ways Hadassah has changed their lives. I can tell them that for the second time I witnessed Dalia Itzik, Speaker of the Knesset, say she believes that "Hadassah is a global symbol of co-existence."

Hadassah Honors Young Women's Council of Harrisburg, 2010 Judith Epstein Young Leadership Award Runner-Up

(Hollywood, FL – July 25, 2010) – Eleven women from the Harrisburg Chapter, Central States Region, were runners-up for the 2010 Judith Epstein Young Leadership Award for founding the Young Women's Council of Harrisburg. The award was announced at Hadassah's National Convention in Hollywood, FL. Hadassah presents this honor each year to young leaders whose community project most successfully promotes Hadassah.

The Young Women's Council of Harrisburg was created in the summer of 2009 to target and engage young members and non-members in the Harrisburg area. Throughout the past year, 69 young women participated in a series of social, educational, and fundraising events hosted by the Council. Through these events the chapter gained 11 new members, three new life members, and five new leaders for their chapter's board. The Council has already started planning for several events scheduled to occur between August 2010 and May 2011.

Robin Rosenthal is the chair of the Young Women's Council. Other members of the planning committee include Helene Caplan, Shari Dym, Jill Kusic, Andrea Lieber, Helene Loux, Luisa Narins, Bonnie Piesner, Tammy Reid, Rosette Roth and Mindy Solomon.

The Judith Epstein Young Leadership Award was named for past national president Judith Epstein, who was an ardent advocate for young women. The award was created in 1991 to recognize the achievements of emerging Hadassah leaders who bring visibility to the organization.





Each year notification of the Yahrzeit date is mailed, in advance, from Israel as a reminder of the observance. On the Yahrzeit day, the name is recited in the Kaddish prayer in the synagogue.
